Horse Show Rules for 2010

1. SVAC (Simi Valley Awards Circuit) follows the guidelines of ETI and USEF (United States Equestrian Federation), however, SVAC Rules prevail. This is a list of basic rules. However, these are not all-inclusive. Please refer to USEF for further details. California drug laws apply.
2. The decision of the Judge is final. It is the responsibility of each owner and exhibitor to be able to furnish proof of eligibility of horse/rider in the event of protest. All protests must be submitted to the Horse Show Committee in writing within 24 hours of supposed offense and be accompanied by \$50.00. Disqualification will result in withdrawal of points for the protested class and redistribution of awards and points.
3. Liability Release - **All exhibitors and handlers must sign the Liability Waiver and Release form.** Parent or legal guardian must sign for riders under the age of 18.
4. Safety - Safety is of the utmost importance. If any person is unable to control a horse in any arena and poses a danger to himself or herself or another exhibitor, they will be excused from the class or arena. If any person is unable to safely handle a horse on the show grounds, they will be excused from the show grounds.
5. Helmets for Junior Riders/Exhibitors - All junior (under age 18) English riders must wear ASTM/SEI safety-approved helmets at all times while mounted. Junior (under age 18) Western riders are also encouraged (but not required) to wear ASTM/SEI safety-approved helmets at all times while mounted, with such headgear considered an acceptable alternative to traditional Western hats in the show class.
6. Class Entries - Entries will close five minutes before class. Scratches must be one class prior in order to receive a refund.
7. Proper Attire - Proper attire is required in all classes unless otherwise stated.
8. Stallions - Stallion handlers/riders must be 18 years or older.
9. Mules & Ponies - Mules and ponies may enter all "horse" classes with the same general restrictions to be applied.
10. Dogs - All dogs must be on a leash.
11. Class Cancellation/Combine - SVAC reserves the right to combine classes with fewer than three entries. SVAC reserves the right to cancel a class because of nonparticipation. SVAC reserves the right to move or change the order of classes during the show. Some classes may therefore be held out of numerical order. It is absolutely and

solely the responsibility of the exhibitor to know where and when their classes are being run.

12. One Exhibitor in Class - If there is only one exhibitor in a class, the exhibitor has the choice of riding the class and receiving (1) point or not riding the class and receiving (1) point ONLY if the exhibitor has paid for the class. If the exhibitor chooses not to ride, he/she also has the option of getting a refund for the class. But under no circumstances will the exhibitor receive a point for a class not paid for. No pay, no point.
13. Schooling is allowed as long as horse and rider are eligible for the class entered. Entrants must wear proper attire, wear their number upside down, and ride non-disruptively. Humane equipment only.
14. Horse Name - Horse must show under same name all year.
15. In the event of death or loss of use of the horse for the remainder of the Horse Show Year, exhibitor must provide a death or vet certificate to the Horse Show Chairperson. Another (1) horse may be substituted for the remainder of the Horse Shows. One substitution per rider or exhibitor.
16. Rider/Horse Age - Rider's age as of December 1st of the previous year is current year Show Age. Horse's age as of January 1st of current year is current year Show Age.
17. Pre-Entry Class Fees - If you pre-enter by the stated deadline, you will receive the Pre-Entry Rate for classes. You may add or scratch classes the day of the show at the pre-entry rate. All other fees and charges will remain the same.
18. Tack Changes - Please register at the show office for tack changes as early as possible. Have your Entry Number and Class Number ready. Tack changes should be effected close to, but not blocking, the In-Gate to avoid unnecessary delays.
19. Amateur Riders - SVAC endorses USEF and ETI rules regarding Amateur Riders. An amateur rider is a person 18 years and older who does not accept remuneration for the following: riding, training, showing in halter, schooling, conducting clinics, seminars, or instructing. The show office may request proof of amateur status. Current USEF or breed association cards are required.
20. ATR (Amateur-to-Ride) Awards - 19 & Over and 39 & Over Classes are open to anyone over 19/39 respectively. However, Corral 118 Day-End and Year-End Awards will be given to the Amateur (non-Professional) with the highest number of points in those divisions.
21. 1st and 2nd Year Green Horse - Open to horses, regardless of horse's age, that have not shown in that class or division prior to December 1, 2008. Horses are ineligible after their second year of showing in that class or division.

22. Lead Line, Age 7 & Under (English and Western) - Riders never to have shown in any performance class other than Lead Line prior to December 1st of previous year. Lead shanks must be attached to a halter. Ponies okay. This class will be held *immediately following* the the lunch break, closest to 12:30 p.m. or as announced.
23. Showmanship - To be judged on the handler.
24. Trail Classes - Trail classes for the High Point shows are open at 9:00 a.m. and are ride-at-will. Otherwise, the Trail classes will be held after Showmanship and will not start before 10:00 a.m. No refunds given for missed trail classes. Please try to show early.
25. Reining - To be judged according to NRHA (National Reining Horse Association) rules, using NRHA patterns. *Green Horse/Rider to be judged according to NRCHA (National Reined Cow Horse Association) rules, using NRCHA patterns.* Pattern numbers will be printed on the show premium and patterns posted at the show (1) hour prior to the class. SVAC reserves the right to rule on any minor discrepancy.
26. Walk/Jog (Western), Walk/Trot (English) and Walk/Jog-Trot Trail: 10 & Under, 11 - 18, and 19 & Over ATR Classes are open to any exhibitor who does not want to show at the lope (Western) or canter (English) for the entire show year in that division at any show. Western, English, and Trail Classes/Divisions will be considered separately. Horse/Rider combination must maintain the same Walk/Jog or Walk/Trot status all year in that specific division. SVAC reserves the right to combine these classes. Walk/Jog and Walk/Trot riders are not eligible for any other riding classes in their respective divisions except Country Pleasure, (must compete at a jog/trot). These riders are eligible to show in Halter and Showmanship.
27. "Color" and "Non-Color" - Color classes are limited to Palominos, Appaloosas, Paints (non-breeding stock), Duns, Buckskins, Pintos and Grullas only. No grays or roans. Non-Color may include grays, roans and no-color/breeding stock/non-patterned Paints and Appaloosas, as well as other typical solid colors, i.e. bay, brown, black, chestnut, and sorrel. "Halter" classes are judged 70% conformation and 30% color. "Pleasure" classes are judged 70% performance and 30% color.
28. Hunter Hack - to be shown and judged at the walk, trot and canter both directions of the ring, and to negotiate (2) fences, chosen at the judge's discretion, at the canter. May be required to hand gallop, either individually, or collectively in pairs or small groups *of not more than (8)*, with safety a prime consideration. *With the exception of ETI NHSC classes, fence height may be adjusted for the age group, at Management's discretion.* Maximum fence height range for Hunter Hack Age-Breaks and Hunter Hack Open will be (1'6" - 2').
29. Working Hunter Open - to be shown at a canter over a full course of (8) fences, using a minimum of (5) different obstacles. Course will be

- posted a minimum of (1) hour prior to the class. Maximum fence height range will be (2' - 2'3"). Protective boots are not allowed. Standing martingales only may be used. Snaffle, Kimberwicke, Pelham bits only. Unusual or unconventional bits not permitted.
30. Equitation Over Fences - Judged on the rider. Horse must be serviceably sound. To be shown at a canter over a full course of (6-8) fences, which will include hunter and/or jumper type obstacles. At least (1) change of lead and a Bending Line will be included. A Trot fence may be included. Courses will be posted a minimum of (1) hour prior to the class. Maximum fence height range for Equitation Over Fences Age-Breaks and Equitation Over Fences Open will be (2' - 2'3"). *With the exception of ETI NHSC classes, fence height may be adjusted for the age group, at Management's discretion.* Protective boots or wraps ARE allowed, if workmanlike and conservative in color. Standing martingales only may be used. Snaffle, Kimberwicke, Pelham bits only. Unusual or unconventional bits or equipment not permitted.
31. Jumpers - to be shown in the 1st Round over a full course of at least (8) fences, using a minimum of (5) different obstacles. Jump-Off Round will be over (5-6) fences and may include obstacles not included in the initial round, however, no fence may exceed maximum height listed in premium. Courses will be posted a minimum of (1) hour prior to the class. Class scored on Faults for knockdowns and refusals and Time Penalties for exceeding time allowed. (Time to be established.) Rubs or touches not to count. Clear first rounds will advance to the Jump-Off Round, with rider remaining in the ring and commencing J/O after Judge's (audible) signal. In the event of no clear first rounds, any tie for 1st Place will require the rider to return for the Jump-Off Round. Be ready at the gate. Please note: exceeding time allowed to start course (45 seconds from Judge's signal), fall of horse and/or rider, a 3rd refusal anywhere on course, being off-course, or exceeding the time limit will result in Elimination. *Refer to USEF Table II, Sec. 2(b) *
32. Day-End Points - All Day-End Points are calculated on a one-horse/one-rider combination. Day-End Points are based on placing only, with 1st = 6 points; 2nd = 5; 3rd = 4; 4th = 3; 5th = 2; and 6th = 1, regardless of number of entries in the class.
33. Day-End Awards - For all Age Breaks and Open Divisions: For Day-End Awards, the rider/exhibitor must have shown in at least (3) or more than half, whichever is greater, of the qualifying classes *in that division* that day in order to receive Day-End Points.
34. SVAC Year-End Points - All Year-End Points are calculated on a one-horse/one-rider combination. Points will be based on placing in class AND number of entries in class. Example: In a class of 6 or more -

Placing 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th would equate to Points received 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 respectively. In a class of 3 - Placing 1st, 2nd, 3rd would equate to Points received 3, 2, 1, respectively.

35. Participation Points for Year-End: All qualified entrants will receive 1/2 point per class as credit for participation if they do not place. These points will count in the Year-End point standings.
36. Schooling entries do not count for Day-End or Year-End Points.
37. SVAC Year-End Division Awards - For all Age Breaks and Open Divisions: the rider/exhibitor must be a current member of Corral 118 and must show in (3) or more than half, whichever is greater of the qualifying classes *in that division* at each of (4) or more out of (6) shows in 2010 to receive Year-End Points in that Division. Highest number of points wins.
38. SVAC Year-End Individual Class Awards - A rider/exhibitor may also accrue Year-End points in Individual Classes. The rider/exhibitor must be a current member of Corral 118 and must show in that specific class at each of (4) or more out of (6) shows in 2010 to receive Year-End Points in that Individual Class. Highest number of points wins.
39. Only Corral 118 members and Associate Members may compete for SVAC Year-End Points and Awards. Points accrue from the date that the exhibitor becomes a member and are not retroactive.
40. Ties for Year-End Awards - Ties will be handled in the following manner: The horse/exhibitor with the most first place awards will move ahead in the standings, (then by most seconds, thirds, etc.) until the tie is broken.
41. Record of Points - Each entrant must accept responsibility to keep track of their own points. Any question or discrepancy must be reported to the Horse Show Point Chairperson within (30) days of point publication on the website, or the points will stand as published.
42. Alcoholic Beverages - No Alcoholic beverages permitted on the show grounds.
43. Refunds - No refunds without Vet/Doctor certificate. Refunds to be mailed within 14 days after close of show.
44. Check Returned by Bank - If your check bounces, so do your points! There will be a \$25.00 charge for a returned check. No reinstatement of points.
45. SVAC *SUPER HORSE Competition - New for 2010* This is a season long competition to showcase and reward a horse's skill and versatility in multiple events in both Western, English, and in-hand OPEN Classes. See Horse Show Premium for all eligible performance classes, designated by an 'S'. Only Corral 118 Members and Associate Members eligible. Must submit the \$10.00 registration fee with a completed Super Horse Registration form prior to accumulation of any points. Must show in a minimum of (5) out of (6) shows in 2010 to

qualify. One-horse/one-rider combination. A horse can only be registered in this program once for 2010 and must be shown by the same exhibitor all year in the Super Horse classes. An exhibitor can only register in this program once for 2010 and must show the same horse all year in the Super Horse classes.

46. SVAC *SUPER HORSE Competition* POINTS: Daily Class Points - See Rule 32 - are based on placing only, with 1st = 6 points; 2nd = 5; 3rd = 4; 4th = 3; 5th = 2; and 6th = 1, regardless of number of entries in the class. There will be no Day-End Award for Super Horse. Year-End Points - See Rule 34 - will be based on placing in class AND number of entries in class. Example: In a class of 6 or more - Placing 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th would equate to Points received 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 respectively. In a class of 3 - Placing 1st, 2nd, 3rd would equate to Points received 3, 2, 1, respectively. Highest number of points wins the Super Horse Award at year's end.

It is every exhibitor's responsibility to know and understand the rules prior to the event.

It is not the responsibility of the show office staff, gatekeeper or any other volunteer to forward or handle a rules inquiry. SVAC will make every effort to answer or resolve the question ASAP. However, SVAC reserves the right to take the time to conduct appropriate research or obtain Committee approval if necessary if an issue cannot be resolved immediately or on-the-spot. SVAC appreciates the exhibitor's courtesy in awaiting a response or resolution.
